
As one of Europe's largest and most successful venues, hosting some 400 events per year and welcoming around four million visitors from every corner of the globe, Excel London generates an astounding 2000 tonnes of waste per annum. Recognising the pressing need to act, their first dedicated Waste Manager, Tom Blake, set his sights on transforming their recycling and implementing comprehensive waste segregation.

## INCOHERENT RECYCLING PRACTICES ON SHOW

The team at Excel had strong ambitions to implement better recycling practices. Although the venue had been segregating non-recyclables and dry mixed recyclables (DMR), there was clearly work to be done. Some streams were not being separated at all, and with recent Simpler Recycling legislation now requiring businesses to separate DMR, food waste, paper and card, and non-recyclable waste streams or face hefty fines, it wasn't a risk they were willing to take.

Not only were some streams being completely missed, but the current recycling system was also not being adhered to due to the design of the bins, unclear signage and a lack of flexibility in the existing system. However, with some simple changes, the potential to do better was evident.

## SOUND SEGREGATION

From only segregating non-recyclables and DMR to now separating non-recyclables, paper and card, plastic and cans, food and glass, the centre has come a long way. They also now have the capability to segregate bulky waste, wood and confidential waste.



## MAKING A CHANGE

Working closely with Ian Sayers, Business Development Manager from RCP, and Will Tippett from SOHO Commercial, the transformation began with a waste walk around the vast site, discussing issues with the current waste management systems and spotting opportunities to improve.

## A SEAMLESS ROLL-OUT


